As Dr. Shane Boylan carefully extracted a 4-foot length of plastic fishing line from the intestines of a Kemp's ridley sea turtle named Peach, a rapt crowd of Aquarium guests stood watch just outside the window of the surgical suite.

They were witnessing a truly historic moment.

This was the first publicly viewed surgery in the newly opened Zucker Family Sea Turtle Recovery™. And it was a life-saving turn for the rare adult Kemp's ridley sea turtle, who would later fully recover and return to the sea, fitted with a satellite tag to track her progress.

It was a year of "firsts" for the South Carolina Aquarium.

The opening of the unprecedented Zucker Family Sea Turtle Recovery heralded an institutional commitment to preserving endangered sea turtle species around the world. With the installation of a CT scanner, exercise tank and

other innovative technology behind the scenes, and groundbreaking educational experiences featuring augmented reality and multi-media in the public space, the Aquarium created a new paradigm for animal care and public engagement.

Last March, we staged an international summit, Breaking Down Plastic, to illuminate the scourge of plastic pollution in our lives. Our leadership on this important topic extended throughout the year, with public testimony on the impacts of plastic on sea turtles and other wildlife, a "plastic art" exhibition staged jointly with the Halsey Institute for Contemporary Art, and the rollout of a citizen science app to track clean-up efforts in our communities and beyond.

Thanks to the PNC Foundation, Kids Coast opened in the fall to great acclaim and quickly became a new hub for young families seeking fun and play in a learning landscape. And tens of thousands of children around the world were provided access to the Aquarium's educators via our web-based distance learning program.

Each of these achievements is a direct reflection of our community's inspirational investment in our Watershed Campaign. We are proud to count you among our many supporters. Thank you for helping us lead the way in connecting people with water, wildlife and wild places.

truly a watershed moment for the Aquarium. We not only expanded our rescue and rehabilitation efforts, but we turned that journey into an experience that our guests will never forget. This extraordinary learning laboratory has now become a platform for activating our guests to respond to issues from climate change to plastic pollution; a call to action beyond our walls.

This year, our award-winning education

programs served more students than ever before, and reached students across the globe. Our distance learning program alone connected more than 20,000 students worldwide to the programs only we can provide, igniting a lifelong passion for safeguarding the future of our planet. The McNair Center for Sea Turtle Conservation and Research has already begun to transform the way animal care professionals manage procedures and rehabilitation. In the past year, our team began to test the effectiveness of utilizing an exercise tank to better prepare our sea turtles patients for their journey home.

In the surgical suite, nearly 4 feet of monofilament line were removed from a patient's system, marking our first publicly viewed surgery and the beginning of an unparalleled learning opportunity about the dangers of plastic in our oceans. Our facility is outfitted with a new CT scanner, enabling our team to look deeper than ever before and facilitating more rapid diagnoses and treatment plans. This state-of-the-art addition sets the South Carolina Aquarium apart from other animal care institutions in the country.

I am so proud of this great work.

Even while working towards realizing the goals of the Watershed Campaign, we never stop dreaming. Early in 2018, together with community leaders, staff and volunteers, we began the process of envisioning the next phase of the Aquarium's growth. We are imagining how we can better serve the community; how we can reach more students; how we can become a more effective voice in conservation: and how we can continue

to delight all of our guests in the most meaningful way. I am excited to share that vision with you in the coming year. Thank you for your continued and generous support and for your belief in this organization. With your support, we continue to inspire and transform our community in ever-evolving ways. CT SCANNER

OYSTER REEF RESTORATION



This new piece of medical-grade equipment was installed in Zucker Family Sea Turtle Recovery, enabling us to significantly improve diagnostic, interventional and intraoperative imaging. Having this technology on-site has elevated the level of specialized animal care we can provide. Additionally, we have proudly shared our CT scanner with medical and educational partners throughout our state.



In partnership with the South Carolina Oyster Restoration and Enhancement Program, more than 100 Aquarium staff, volunteers and supporters helped to construct a large oyster reef from recycled oyster shells along the bank of Wappoo Creek. The reef helps prevent erosion and creates habitat for juvenile fish, crabs and other saltmarsh animals. Preliminary observations of the reef's progress indicate that the restoration project was a success.

PEACH'S SURGERY



Peach was only the third adult
Kemp's ridley ever treated at the Sea
Turtle Care Center™. Dr. Shane Boylan
and our medical team conducted two
surgeries to remove nearly 4 feet of
monofilament fishing line from Peach's
gastrointestinal tract. The procedures
were the first publicly viewed
surgeries, making them especially
meaningful. Peach was also one of
the first sea turtle patients to use the
exercise tank in Zucker Family
Sea Turtle Recovery, preparing her
for her return to the ocean.

KIDS COAST



In partnership with the PNC
Foundation, we opened Kids Coast, an inspiring play area that encourages exploration with peers and promotes play-based learning. We expect to serve more than 60,000 toddlers each year, inspiring the next generation of conservationists by connecting our youngest visitors to water, wildlife and wild places.

SEA CHANGE



In partnership with the Halsey Institute of Contemporary Art, we presented Sea Change, a sculptural and photographic exhibit, to the Charleston community – expanding the reach of both institutions. The exhibit showcased the work of two prominent artists expressing critical conservation themes addressing the scourge of plastic pollution. Sixteen area art teachers from Sumter, Charleston and Berkeley counties also participated in a hands-on workshop with featured artist Aurora Robson at the Aquarium.

DISTANCE LEARNING PROGRAM

Using videoconferencing technology to connect with classrooms nationwide, our distance learning program enables Aquarium educators to share knowledge, answer questions and provide an up-close look at our animals and exhibits. We reached 21,812 people (double our original goal) by implementing this program in states such as South Carolina, New York, Colorado, California and Ohio.

OPEN-ACCESS INITIATIVES

CITIZEN SCIENCE






